Hi everyone,

There must be a word which means "quiet but not quiet" but I'm buggered if I know what it is. Anyway, everyone is extremely busy but, really, there is not very much firm news to tell you at the moment. So, during this quiet but not quiet time we thought it would be interesting to look back over the years from your, the fans, point of view. We mentioned last time that Ian was trying to acquire the rights to the Eclectic video - well, still working on it but no news at present.

3rd March was the white label "club test" release of "IABC" dance mix (12 RIPE 221 - 12") which charted at 38 for one week. We were, therefore, hopeful for a commercial release of this in June but it now appears that this will be included on an RCR compilation due out during the summer. There is the POSSIBILITY that I may be able to get hold of some of these white labels to sell. I'll try anyway.

The "Rarities" and "Restless Natives" saga continues! We are still hopeful that this WILL be released but, July will come and go without it hitting the shops!! Release date now scheduled for 15th September.

The "Eclectic" album is now expected to be released in America the last week of August, possibly with a slightly different track-listing - more BC songs and fewer covers plus a previously unrecorded song from Stuart as a bonus track. Stuart, at least, will be doing some promo over there with the release but it is looking more likely that there will be some BC dates in the States during late September - acoustic with, possibly, a few electric gigs as well. Naturally, I will let you know if, when and where.

Castle, apparently, recorded the band's gig at Brighton on 5th November 1995 and two guys from the now disintegrated Castle label have teamed up together to form a new record label and they have bought the rights to this recording which is expected to be released on CD later in the year.

As far as anyone can remember, in all of the fifteen years that BC have been together this could be their first year "off", and even if the American dates do happen later in the year the "year off" will remain fact as far as Europe is concerned.

Tony: Great West Records, Tony's record company, is to be officially launched on Saturday 2nd August at the Cornwall Coliseum. The show is to be called "The Great Big Noise" and tickets will go on sale in early to mid June.

Tony's solo album, plus four of his first signings to GWR will be released on 4th August. These CDs will only be available in record shops in Devon and Cornwall or direct from GWR via mail order and the internet.

Tony will be performing at the GWR launch on 2nd August with an, as yet, all-unknown band and as a warm up for this show there will be a gig on 31st July in a club to be confirmed in Plymouth.

Full details on all of the above will be passed on to you as soon as known.

Stuart: As far as Stuart is concerned he is having a great time working out in Nashville and we will keep you up-to-date when there is something firm to tell you. He's writing with several other writers and hopefully by the next issue we will have lots to pass on from and about Stuart.

Bruce: It's now official, Bruce's band is called "Wild Blue Yonder". They have been and are doing local pub gigs which are going well. I realise it's a bit late but 22nd May - Eastport Bar, Dunfermline and Sunday 1st June at Tappie Toories.

Mark: Still loads of projects in hand and the following is correct at the time of going to print:-Basically Mark is doing loads of writing with Josh Phillips for various people.

Recently Mark appeared with Whitesnake at a charity gig in Buckingham which, Mark tells me, was fantastic. They have a new vocalist but the rest of the line up were the original band members and there will be more gigs.

Then, during June Mark will be with Bernie Marsden and Micky Moody's band "Moody Marsden".

22nd June - Kiev with Procul Harem

26th July at The Roand House, Camden (to be confirmed) with The Crazy World of Arthur Brown.

Recording soon with The Crazy World of Arthur Brown (songs written by Mark, Josh and Arthur Brown)

29th August - Edinbrugh Festival with Midge Ure and Josh with the POSSIBILITY of other gigs on Saturday 30th/Sunday 31st.

In the last issue I mentioned that Mark was working with a couple of female vocalists. Well, They are Debbie and Katie who go under the name of "Sister Sister" - songs written by Mark, Josh, Debbie and Katie and they have about half an album together at present.

We also mentioned a project with a young male vocalst - This is Rob Collins, a 21 year old with, apparently, an incredible voice. Josh's girlfriend is a TV researcher who was working on a pilot talent show, Rob Collins was part of this show (apparently the show has not been aired - not sure whether it will be) and he was amazing with a great attitude and in Mark's description of him such words as Elvis, George Michael, classic, Frank Sinatra, young, great talent were used and "The Sun" has given him a bit of space already to say "Watch out for Rob Collins in 1998". Anyway, Mark and Josh are also writing for him.

So, there you have Mark's news but, as he said on the phone, this is all correct as 27th May at 11.30am!!

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Kevin Wright (003299) asks

Q Is there a possibility of obtaining the rights to the Das Fest concert and releasing this as a CD or video. I think this is one of their best concerts to date and am convinced it would sell well?

Ian There are a couple of live recordings out at the moment with another expected later in the year. How many can be out there at the same time? So really there is no hurry in obtaining rights or releasing any other live performance(s) at the moment.

Q Will Big Country be looking for a long term record deal (ten years as an example) or would they go for a licensing deal? How would a licensing deal work?

Ian I really have no idea what sort of deal at the moment. We are not evening considering it yet.

Q Looking back at "Why The Long Face" how do you feel about the album now? Did you achieve what you set out to do with this record and do you feel it was an improvement on the Buffalo Skinners?

Ian WTLF did not really do what we hd hoped for but, I think BS was the best album. It did, however, put BC back on the map.

Tony I feel the same way about these two albums as I always have. Great albums released at the wrong time by the wrong companies. As to whether one album was an improvement on the other I think is irrelevant. They are two good albums that came one after the other. It's what came after that should be questioned.

Bruce They were just different albums so I can't say that one was an improvement on the other. "Nit", that about sums it up.

Q Have the band ever played "Flame Of The West" at any gigs?

Ian Yes, on the "Steeltown" tour.

Q Are there any songs that you would like to bring back into the live set that you have not played for a while?

Tony For the first time in fifteen years I have had a chance to put the band's music out of my mind but occasionally I hear a track on the radio or somebody will buy me a pint just so they can tell me where they were when they first heard "Look Away" or had their first shag with "Chance" playing in the background. To answer your question, I would be quite happy to play all new stuff next time we tour or really dig deep into past albums. Who knows, we'll see.

Bruce Not really, I'd like to play new stuff.

Mark "Close Action" and I've always wanted to do "The Crossing" but that wish seemed to fall on deaf ears!

Q Over the years BC have played support to many of the best bands in the world (The Jam, U2, Thin Lizzy, Queen, Rolling Stones etc) but who were your personal favourites and why?

Ian They were all very significant although they didn't support Thin Lizzy, Jim. The Jam launched the band with the wonderful opportunity of being able to play to 60,000, Queen was just phenomenal, playing to 180,000 and The Stones was just brilliant and fantastic fun.

Tony Unfortunately we never supported Thin Lizzy but I'm sure that would have been cool. All the other bands you mentioned were great, memorable nights but to document them is a bit like train-spotting to me.

Mark Probably "The Jam" 'cos I really liked them when I was younger. It was a real thrill to be around those who I had idolised - it was special in that it was our first big gig and we were just taking off and it was The Jam's "farewell tour" - it was just great to be around them at that time.

Bruce With no hesitation Bruce said, "The Stones, they are really nice people and we got to know them really well. They looked after us supberly and made it so easy."

Q A couple of years ago Neil Young made an album with Pearl Jam as the backing band ("Mirrorball"). If BC were to play backing band to anyone recording an album who would they like it to be?

Tony Neil Young, because every band should get to do an album with him.

Mark London Symphony Orchestra. I think the different instrumentation would be fantastic.

Bruce I'm not that sure I'd really like to do this but perhaps Bob Dylan and Neil Young.

Q Last year there was a project you were working on called "Project X", then it was no more. What was it, what happened?

Tony Project X will happen but not just yet. There are too many individual projects going on at the moment.

Q Which of BC's albums is your own personal favourite?

Tony The next one! And that's the way it should be.

Mark "No Place Like Home". This album was unfairly dismissed by all and grossly underrated. Of the more obscure stuff I think "Soapy Soutar" is fantastic, the keyboards bring in a different element.

Bruce Again, no hesitation - "Buffalo Skinners".
